INTRODUCTION

Boards are facing an ever-increasing scale of challenges. The evolving governance landscape, digital transformation, increased focus on environmental, social and governance (ESG) issues and the shifting geopolitical environment have forced many businesses to reset their businesses on the path to growth and sustainability. Companies and their boards are under intense scrutiny from shareholders, regulators, employees, customers, suppliers, the media and other stakeholders. In times of uncertainty, the roles and responsibilities of a director are even more demanding. An effective board should go beyond satisfying basic oversight functions.

As the national association of directors, professional development is at the core of SID's mission to promote director learning and board effectiveness. To help directors thrive in volatile, uncertain, complex and ambiguous times, SID has curated a suite of professional development programmes based on the functional directorship and business competencies required of future-ready directors. These are listed under the two broad categories in the following tables on page 3.

Directorship competencies

Training courses to hone a director's basic competencies are listed under Table 1: Directorship competencies. These programmes are focused on developing fundamental and essential directorship skills and knowledge, such as the roles and responsibilities of directors and boards, financial reporting, strategy, audit and risk controls.

Business and future-ready skills

Business and future-ready competencies, including transdisciplinary skills, decision making, sense making, resilience building and digital fluency, are the focus of development and training in the advanced and specific masterclasses in Table 2: Business and future-ready competencies.

Holistic professional development

To address the learning needs of members at various stages of their directorship journey, SID offers a curriculum of Fundamentals and Essentials courses to help members develop domain competencies at a foundational level. We have also increased the range of advanced programmes, Masterclasses, Pit-Stops and Current Topics for deep diving and specialisation.

A hybrid learning approach will continue, with most courses conducted in-person and some online to cater for directors with a need for flexible learning options. This includes a blended learning series that combines pre-reading material with interactive discussions.

SID is also exploring new learning pathways for members to develop and hone their directorship competencies holistically. Beyond training courses, the pathways will include applied learning, assessment, mentoring and accreditation. Corporate members can also engage SID to provide bespoke training for their boards to enhance board capabilities and effectiveness.

Continuing Professional Development hours

The comprehensive curriculum offered by SID addresses the various stages of a director's journey, from aspiring and new directors to board committees and board chairs. The courses support the learning needs of directors in private, listed and international companies, as well as nonprofit organisations.

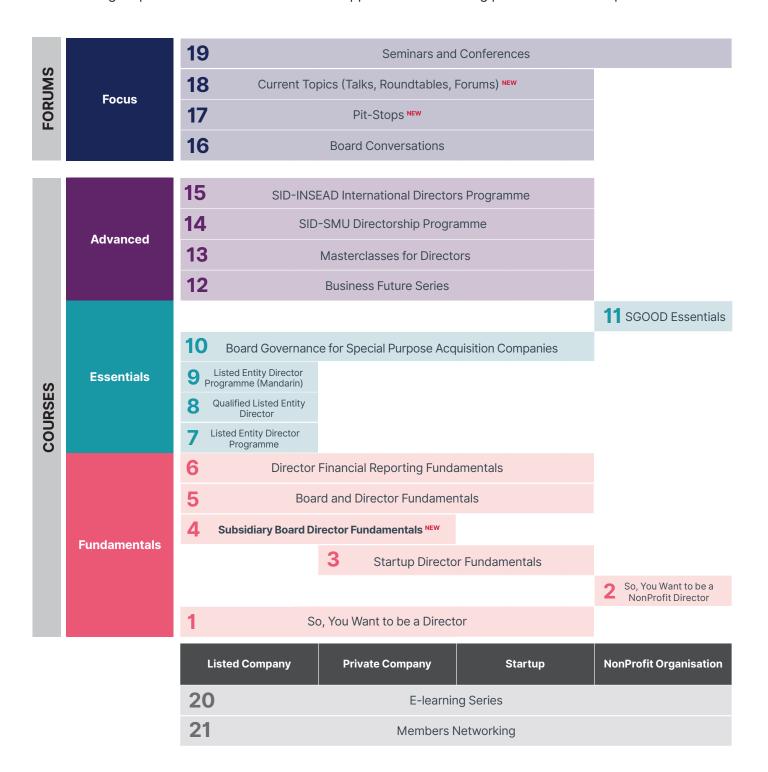

DIRECTOR FINANCIAL REPORTING FUNDAMENTALS

It provides directors with essential accounting knowledge and practical tips, and equips them with the key tools and concepts to review company financial statements. Through the case studies and related discussions on situations involving financial and accounting matters, participants will learn what to watch out for in financial statements and how to avoid common mistakes.

ENVIRONMENTAL, SOCIAL AND GOVERNANCE ESSENTIALS

Level	Essentials.
Course Description	This course delves into the role and responsibilities of the board and directors in sustainability governance. It examines the impact and implications of environmental, social and governance (ESG) developments, and climate-related risks and opportunities on businesses. In highlighting the recommendations of the Task Force on Climate-Related Financial Disclosures (TCFD) and SGX Listing Rules on sustainability reporting, this session provides a useful background for directors to drive sustainability compliance and integrate ESG factors into their business strategy.

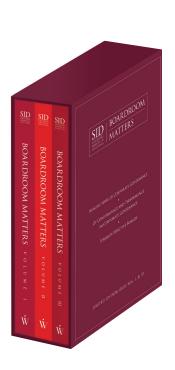

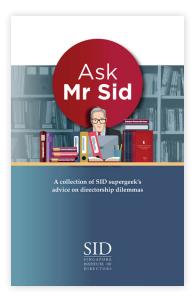

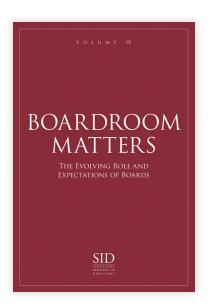

The Singapore Institute of Directors (SID) is Singapore's national association for company directors.
